As part of our ongoing commitment to rural communities, Twin Lakes and the Foundation for Rural Service (FRS) awarded more than \$100,000 to 22 local organizations to enhance the quality of life for those who live, work, and play in the Upper Cumberland region. These organizations include schools, museums, fire departments, economic development groups and more.

Established in 2020, the Twin Lakes Difference Grant has provided over \$245,000 in funding to more than 40 local organizations seeking technology funds to improve the quality of life within the Twin Lakes serving area.

The Affordable **Connectivity Program**

You could be eligible for a discount toward broadband service.

The Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) is a federal government benefit program operated by the FCC that helps ensure that households can afford the broadband they need for work, school, healthcare and more.

The benefit provides a discount of up to \$30 per month toward internet service for eligible households. All Twin Lakes broadband packages are ACP compliant.
